Redemptive Discipline



“God disciplines us for our good, that we may share in His holiness”. Hebrews 12:10

The Bible emphasises the importance of discipline. But how should we go about it? There are five main perspectives of discipline to consider, the authoritarian, permissive, bombastic, democratic, and redemptive.

The first questions we need to ask ourselves is: What is the purpose of discipline? Through the way we discipline, what do we want to achieve?

Authoritarian - Attempts to break the will of the child

Permissive - Permits the Childs will to rule

Bombastic - Threatens the Childs will

Democratic - Focuses on internal control and reason

Redemptive - Prepares the child for moral self-governance

Our children learn about God’s character by observing how it is reflected in our own lives. The way we discipline our children often informs the picture they have of God.

It is important to remember that God gives us the freedom to make mistakes; and then transform our failures into learning experiences. He focuses on transformation, rather than condemnation. God sees us, not as we are, but as we can become.

By allowing us the freedom of choice, God provides the foundation for obedience based on love, which is itself the expression of self-government. (Redemptive)

Here are a few tips to consider: Recognise and develop your Childs potential, focus on strengths rather than deficiencies, show that you truly care, provide your child with a voice when making rules, show that you trust them, ask rather than command, appeal to your child’s desire to be logical, have fewer well considered rules.

Starts up again next week.

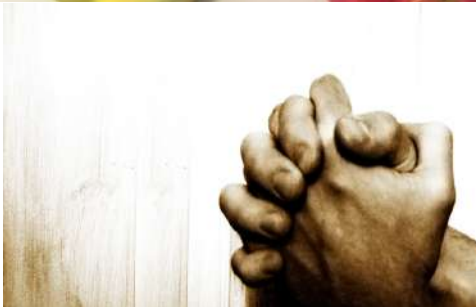


Attendance Dues Forms

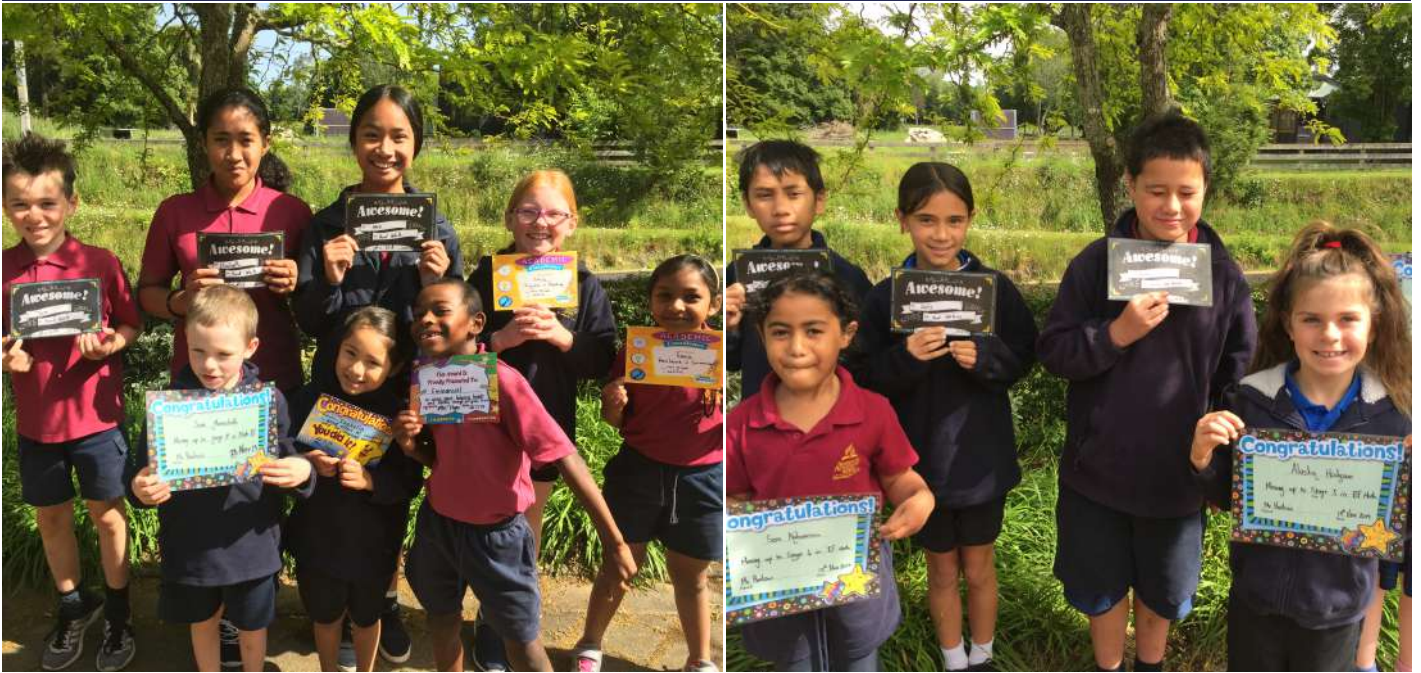
