

Our Deep Hope

Our students will encounter the heart of God, as they walk in a growing relationship with Him and with others, that inspires them to make a positive impact for His Kingdom

It's easy to feel the ground shaking lately. Everywhere we look, it seems there's turmoil. We see it in the news-from wild weather battering communities to the ongoing strain of teacher strikes and the passionate debates over curriculum changes that spark such significant kickback. The challenges facing our nation can feel relentless, and as leaders, it can be tempting for our focus to be drawn into the immediate crises.

Yet, something remarkable happened at our Christian Principals Leadership meeting this week.

None of these immediate challenges—the strikes, the curriculum changes, the policy battles-were the main topics taking up our collective thinking space. Instead, our conversations revolved around something far more foundational and enduring: the very mission of Christian education and the profound heart for transformation that defines our work.

We talked about how to cultivate genuine Christian character in students. We explored strategies for integrating faith authentically across all subjects. We shared ideas not on how to react to the latest headline, but how to proactively shape young lives for Christ.

It was a powerful reminder that while the world around us may be in constant flux, the core of what we do is unshakeable.

Faith is UNMOVEABLE.

This distinction isn't about ignoring the realities of our world; it's about leading from a place of deep conviction.

The difficulties we face—the external pressures, the societal shifts—are like the fierce winds and waves described in scripture. They are powerful, they are real, but they do not determine the course. Our focus on mission is the anchor that holds us steady. It is the unwavering belief that Faith is unmoveable—a firm foundation upon which we build schools, curriculum, and, most importantly, lives.

The world needs Christian schools to be a source of calm and consistent truth now more than ever. When we, as leaders, prioritize the eternal—the transformation of hearts and minds for God's glory over the temporary, we equip our staff and students to do the same.

Whether at home or in your community, my prayer is that you continue to reveal the heart of God, knowing that in the midst of every storm, our foundation in Christ remains firm.
